Hi everyone this is Ted this time.

What a mighty God we serve!!!! We have been so blessed this week to have a group from Eastern Washington. A youth group from North Shore Community Church in Manson, Washington sent us some wonderful young folks who have worked hard this week to pour a slab and make a clothes line area. They also had VBS for our kids and did a health brigade for a local church where they teach good health habits and present the gospel.

It is so awesome to walk into Gabriel House and see a group of teenagers sitting on the floor holding my kids in their laps just playing and singing with them. This hard working group of young people not only brought the money to pay for the slab they poured, they also paid a sizeable portion of our workers' payroll. We love our faithful workers and it really blessed us to see them get the wages they so richly deserve. We had a tearful hallelujah party over that with heartfelt hugs all around. Our workers were so grateful they cried.

Missionary Alliance Church is sending us a group of builders next week, and they are going to build our boys' new quarters, a 28 by forty foot, two room structure, with two complete handicapped bathrooms. We are building it strong enough for two large rooms upstairs so groups can come and stay with us on campus. There will be men's and women's dorms and showers on the second floor. We don't have enough resources to do the second floor at this time but the first floor for the boys will be completed this summer.

Even with an economic recession God has shown us through prayer and His wisdom, creative ways to make the fewer dollars we are receiving stretch farther. A local commercial free-range organically raised chicken farmer provides us with free chicken livers which are very high in protein and iron for the kids diets. So we have chicken livers once a week and we share them with our workers to take home to their families.

The electric company offered us the opportunity to change our electric to the commercial rate. Though it cost us about \$200.00 dollars initially to make the change from residential to commercial, we find that it saves us about \$600.00 per month to be on the commercial plan.

The government of Mexico has developed a health insurance for the poor. It has taken a lot of hard work and red tape but all of our children have been signed up and this has cut our medication costs by at least half.

We have had the blessing of Becky Wiggins working with the big boys for the past 6 months. Becky is a dedicated and tireless worker and the boys and our Mexican workers love her. They have learned from her, and she from them.

Hanna Morse is now serving for three months with Gabriel House. Hanna brings experience, energy and a fresh approach to our HIV and toddler kiddies program.

We are sure that God has more blessings in store for Gabriel House. We still need your prayers and your offerings, but we have His promise that He will sustain us and He will bless those who give.

This month we say goodbye to Kim Cysewski. Kim has faithfully served Gabriel House for 5 years. She now feels led to serve more in her local Mexican Church and with the orphanage known as Estatal 29.
